Humanity and Justice will Prevail



On the Jewish calendar, there are three pilgrimage holidays: Sukkot, Passover and Shavuot. They are times when our ancient ancestors made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Still, today, we hold Festival Services on the first and last days of the holiday, including “yizkor” memorial prayers. We easily recall Sukkot, because it comes five days after Yom Kippur, and the Sukkah welcomes us and our guests to wave the lulav and spend time in the fragile booth. Passover needs no explanation, because it remains one of the most important holidays to Jewish families even more so than Chanukah. But, Shavuot, which comes this year in late May, is often misunderstood.

Shavuot is the holiday that comes fifty days after Passover. As Passover celebrates redemption, Shavuot celebrates revelation. At Mount Sinai, the Torah was revealed and given to the Israelites who waited for God’s teachings. The holiday is also called, “Z’man Matan Torateinu,” the season of the giving of Torah. The Torah portion for the holiday is the Ten Commandments, from Exodus 20, and in some synagogues the congregation rises during the Torah reading to emulate the Israelites who stood at Sinai.

Earlier this year, our scholar-in-residence, Rabbi Ofek Meir, from Leo Baeck Education Center in Haifa, Israel, taught that Torah and Truth were given at Sinai. It came to the Israelite people from the mountaintop. Ever since that time, Truth would come from the people. That is, Truth entered the world with Torah, and now it is our obligation to lift up Truth from the earth to all the places where it’s needed.

There is no question but that our world is hungry for Truth. With a capital “T,” it is a truth that is beyond relative contemporary understandings of what is truth. This Truth is without qualification for it is inextricably linked to religious values that have come down to us, not just from a mountain, but also from generations past. Truth is undeniable and no despot or dictator, from Haman to Hitler, can alter it forever. Ultimately, Truth contains a power that still emanates from the high place from which it came and still inspires the people who stood up to receive it. Though we stand far from those days, it is the same Torah and the same Truth that we receive. And, it is the same Torah and Truth that sustained our people to see another day after periods of darkness and despair.

Even now, when our world hungers for truth, again, rest assured that Torah Truth, in able hands, will prevail. Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch wrote, “Preserve your humanity and the values of integrity that you learned from God; and in the end, humanity and justice will win over vulgarity and violence.” On Shavuot, May 29, 2020, we’ll make a pilgrimage to the Gordon Chapel, to commemorate the time we still call, “Z’man Matan Torateinu.”

KEHILLAH High

This year's Confirmation ceremony will be on Friday, May 15, at 6:30 pm.

On February 23, the 11th grade traveled to UT-Austin for the day to tour the campus, engage in conversation around Jewish life on campus, and meet with our alumni.

From December 21-25, Houston-area eighth and ninth graders participated in the Citywide Alternative Winter Break hosted by Kehillah High. In partnership with the Jewish Federation of Greater Houston's Act Now initiative, the group volunteered a combined 400 hours sorting donations with the Houston Food Bank, gardening organic vegetables with Finca Tres Robles Farm, rebuilding two homes with SBP, and serving Christmas lunch with Citywide Club of America at the George R. Brown Convention Center. After Hurricane Harvey, the students and I decided that we would alternate between volunteering in another city, like last year's trip to New Orleans, and making a difference right here in our own community. Students from Chalon L'Atid, Congregation Emanu El, and Kehillah High joined in service together with organizations working to end hunger, rebuild homes, and revitalize the community here in Houston.

Kehillah High will celebrate the completion of its fifth year, as well as the graduating class of 2020 on Wednesday, April 22, at Congregation Brith Shalom. Everyone is invited to attend.

Kehillah High is funded by the Jewish Federation of Greater Houston and its Fund for the Jewish Future, the Houston Jewish Community Foundation, participating congregations, and donors. ABIDE Continues to do Great Work!

ABIDE continues to plan for our Muslim Jewish Gun Safety Campaign.

We have met with Houston's Police Chief, as well as ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms) regional representatives to get accurate information about gun violence in our communities. We are partnering with Moms Demand Action to provide gun safety education, and with TMO (The Metropolitan Organization) to reach more congregations.

ABIDE will host a public meeting about gun safety with Houston Police Chief Art Acevedo on Thursday, April 16 – please mark the date on your calendar! We will provide information to promote public interest and increase understanding of what each of us can do to save lives by reducing gun violence.

Free gun locks will be available for gun owners, as well as posters and other materials for work places, schools, etc.

We will also be offering more "Congregational Conversations" in the future, to learn what more congregants consider the most urgent needs in our communities.

ABIDE will again provide voter registration/engagement information as the fall election approaches.

Kids' Meals 5K a Huge Success

Congregation Beth Israel members know how to make a difference. On a chilly January Sunday, hundreds of Beth Israel members gathered to make 5,000 lunches for Houston's hungriest preschool-aged children. Kids' Meals, Inc., our partner organization, works to supply food for children under 6 because they are too young to qualify for school-based free meal programs.

Our morning began in the Sanctuary with the students of the Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center and all of the volunteers. Cantor Trompeter and Rabbi Lyon led us in prayers and helped us all to frame the important work that we were about to do and warmup our souls. Irv Berger, chair of the Social Justice Committee introduced Kids' Meals Executive Director, Beth Harp, who taught our community about the Kids' Meals mission and the staggering statistics about childhood hunger in Houston. Did you know that 1 in 4 children in Houston are food insecure, meaning they lack reliable access to sufficient quantities of healthy, nutritious food? Rabbi Scott helped conclude our program with a warmup for our bodies. We moved into Wolff-Toomim Hall and in less than 65 minutes our community made those 5,000 lunches and loaded them all onto the refrigerated Kids' Meals truck.

Rabbi Eleanor Steinman said "I am so grateful to this community for their support of the Kids' Meals 5K. Thank you. Please join our robust monthly gatherings on the fourth Wednesday of the month when we make 1,250 lunches together."


