"Praying for Daily Miracles"



Of the many ritual items, books, and sacred texts we appreciate in our faith, we have been taught that the siddur or prayerbook is among the most prized and treasured. In a somewhat compact and accessible fashion, we can approach a prayerbook in a much different way than our sacred Torah scroll. A prayerbook can come in many sizes and offer many different interpretations. The Reform movement itself has seen an important evolution from the Union Prayer Book, to Gates of Prayer, and to Mishkan Tefillah. Each edition signified an important stage in our relationship to prayer. Not only the ancient Hebrew texts, but the

important English translations. Today, we include more Hebrew on each page alongside transliteration, demonstrating that all should have access to pray in our sacred tongue, regardless of proficiency or comfort level.

Throughout this pandemic, we've come together on Shabbat and holidays. The comfort and familiarity of our services have helped to bring us together, even though we've been physically separated. But, our liturgy isn't only reserved for these special times. Our weekday prayers can help center us during particularly challenging and difficult days. For those moments when we feel lost and unfocused, we find comfort in our daily morning prayers. This can be a meaningful and significant way to begin our day.

Traditionally, when we wake up to experience a new day, we give thanks to God for restoring our soul. We offer thanks that our bodies are functioning and pray that we will continue to be sustained by acknowledging our soul, a gift from God. One of the most beautiful sections of the morning service is the section known as "Nisim B'chol Yom," or daily miracles. These daily miracles include praising God for giving us our physical body, which is a sacred vessel that allows us to perform certain tasks. It also reaffirms our connection to the Divine presence, which helps to strengthen our efforts in bringing about justice, equality, and participating in acts of loving-kindness. Though we may wake up feeling weary and fearful of the challenges that are before us, this series of blessings acknowledges that there are still miracles around us. Regardless of our ability to read the traditional text or name our own daily miracles, this could be a helpful and productive tool as we strive to fuel our souls. By developing a prayer practice, we can cultivate a deeper appreciation for what still exists, rather than focusing on what we have lost.

When we have our health, we can offer thanks to God. When we are in need of healing, we can ask for courage and strength. When we need to envision a more positive future, we can ask for greater insight, and clarity. When we simply want to make it through the day, we can ask for God's help to do that in a more meaningful and desirable way.

Prayer is a unifying force in our tradition. Regardless of the language we may choose, expressing our daily blessings acknowledges our partnership with the Divine and sacred. May we look ahead to brighter days and greater peace, as we strive for good health, hope, and peace.

On a cold and damp Friday evening last winter in Seattle, I was waiting in my car in the Temple parking lot for services. Then the rain started pelting down. The trip across the parking lot looked dismal so I drove home and decided to search for services online. I found a YouTube video of Congregation Beth Israel, watched services online until the weather improved, and then I returned to in-person attendance.

When COVID struck, I wanted to attend Passover services. The technology of the local Temple wasn't up to speed so I returned to Beth Israel, and I have been attending ever since.

Until the hospital that I worked at felt that it was safe for me to return to work, I was so pleased with my growing connection to your Congregation. I attended Zoom meetings, was introduced to the clergy, and didn't miss a Friday night. I've corresponded with members I've met in the Basic Judaism class and in Saturday morning Minyan. My association with Beth Israel has helped me through the dark months when I had to be at home and thought I'd never be able to return to the hospital where I've worked for twenty years. It was so difficult to be suddenly removed from my community. Beth Israel provided me with the support I needed. I officially joined because I want to be a part of your community and even though I'm now back at work now, I intend to continue. As soon as COVID is in control, I plan to visit Houston and be in the sanctuary on a Friday night!

I chose between a career in art or writing vs. a career in medicine where I could earn a salary and paint or write or whatever after work hours, and it's worked out just fine. I started life as a surgeon (everyone can make a wrong choice) and then shifted to psychiatry, a much better specialty selection. I began to paint seriously in 1990, and changed to working in porcelain in 2000 as painting was too much of an isolative activity. I returned to painting a few years ago when my cat developed asthma and the clay dust was detrimental.

INTRODUCING RABBI AARON SATALOFF

Assistant Rabbi at Congregation Beth Israel

Back in March, we announced Rabbi Aaron Sataloff as the new Assistant Rabbi and then as we all know the city shut down and everything moved online. Rabbi Sataloff officially moved to Houston in July and since many of you have not been able to meet Rabbi Sataloff in person, we thought we'd feature him.

Rabbi Sataloff was born in Memphis and spent most of his life moving (TN, NJ, WA, VA, CA, and OR), as his father served in various administrative positions in Jewish Community Centers. His father is his very best friend (dog not included) and mentor. His family is his world, and they've been through a lot together. They once drove cross-country in a conversion van, so he's reasonably confident they can survive anything. His mother works as a preschool teacher in a Reform shul, and his sister also works at a JCC. They pretty much all drank the Manischewitz Kool-Aid. However, while "social Judaism" was his life for many years, eventually, he discovered that he loved learning about Judaism. You might be thinking, "Aaron, you're a rabbi, isn't that a given?" The simple truth is that Judaism, the religion, not the people, never appealed to him until he found it for himself.

When he was 12, his synagogue informed him that a Bar Mitzvah was "out of the question." His Hebrew skills were inadequate. Rabbi Sataloff was hurt and angry. Nonetheless, after months of private tutoring and a move to a Reform temple, he made it through his rite of passage. He vowed never to retake another Hebrew class. That is until he assumed he could earn an

easy "A" in Biblical Hebrew during his sophomore year at the University of Oregon. He was wrong. It wasn't easy. But he did pass! Moreover, the synergy between faith and academics - between sacred text and knowledge - produced a sensation he had never experienced while sitting in a classroom - unrelenting interest.

Yet, his journey hit a pause when he was diagnosed that very winter with testicular cancer. He was forced to take a leave of absence for medical treatment. However, something really amazing happened at a time when his life seemed broken. When he felt broken. While sitting across the table from a rabbi who he reluctantly accepted an invitation for coffee with (his dad convinced him it would be a good idea), he had his "come-to-Judaism" moment. Their conversation wasn't particularly deep, his fault, not the rabbi's, but learning about the rabbi's journey pushed him to understand his better. He loved the Jewish people. He loved sitting down and learning about others, making connections, spirituality, music, Israel, summer camp, community, and he loved coffee (black, extra shot - a "Red Eye" if we're being fancy about it). Ultimately, he loved Hebrew (it's a complicated relationship). At Peet's Coffee in downtown Los Altos, he realized that being a rabbi was the only option. That moment where the spotlight hits and everything else fades to black. There was nothing else he wanted to do more than that. Rabbinics was his first love.

His journey had been brewing for quite a while, but he never realized it. That is, until he put all the pieces together like a TV drama detective staring at the wall of pin-up evidence. And that's where his story begins. After his recovery, he decided to take a gap year and move to Israel to participate in Project OTZMA, a volunteer-based Israel program. While tempted to join the IDF and never return home, he ultimately realized that becoming a rabbi meant he would have to finish undergrad. However, after graduation in 2011, he flew back to Israel to attend Hebrew Ulpan on Kibbutz Tzuba, because the only thing standing in his way of rabbinical school was a Hebrew test (the irony is not lost on him, he promises). In the foothills of Jerusalem is where he applied and was accepted to Hebrew Union College -Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) in Los Angeles. His journey had brought him full circle.

With that being said, he holds a B.A. in Judaic Studies from the University of Oregon and Rabbinic Ordination from HUC-JIR in Los Angeles. He also holds an M.A. from the Zelikow School of Jewish Nonprofit Management.

If you ever talk to Rabbi Sataloff, it won't be long before he mentions his dog, Charlie, who he met at Waffle House just three weeks after he moved to Georgia. Rabbi Sataloff wants to know our members and says to please call, text, or email him!

We may not have been together physically in our Temple but we were together online for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

Over 10,000 members, friends, and families joined us for our online High Holy Days services and over 1,000 prayer books were borrowed! It was an unusual year but our community came together in unique ways both in person and virtually. We had families across the pond who were able to watch services together for the first time in years, families who donned masks so they could be together, and families who watched services virtually together so they could keep loved ones safe.

Israel and two Arab Gulf states, the United Arab Emirates and Bahrain, have formally and publicly established diplomatic relations. The White House is calling the agreements "The Abraham Accords." The U.A.E. and Bahrain are the third and fourth Arab countries to open diplomatic relations with Israel; Egypt in 1979, and Jordan in 1994 were the first two and Sudan joined in Oct. 2020.

Eric K. Ward is a nationally-recognized expert on the relationship between authoritarian movements, hate violence, and preserving inclusive democracy. In his 30+ year civil rights career, he has worked with community groups, government and business leaders, human rights advocates, and philanthropy as an organizer, director, program officer, consultant, and board member. Eric's widely quoted writings and speeches are credited with key narrative shifts. He currently serves as Executive Director of Western States Center, Senior Fellow with Southern Poverty Law Center and Race Forward, and Co-Chair for The Proteus Fund. 



After the contest, players joined a Zoom hosted by Beat the Lock. While they couldn't physically be in the spy-themed room, the children worked together to decipher the clues and instruct


'Ellen,' the spy in the room, on how to break free. While the clues were not easy, Beat the Lock Escape Rooms designs youth events based on grade

You have walked by it, browsed, and shopped in it, but do you know the history of the Sisterhood Gift Shop and what your purchases mean to the Temple?

In 1966 Janice Sellinger Caplan began working for the Sisterhood Giftshop at Beth Israel. Back then it was by the bride's room across from the chapel and it was small. Very small. She was one of the few salaried positions and as time went on she did more and more, eventually doing all the buying for the shop and coordinating all the major events that Sisterhood put on. These events included luncheons, catering for the B'nei Mitzvahs, and a huge garage sale that was in the

Wolff-Toomim Hall every summer. They even did a talent show where all the members used to perform. What a sight that must have been!

As one would imagine, Janice was very busy managing the store and coordinating all the Sisterhood events, but she had help from a wonderful woman, her mother. Her mom became her back up person to merchandise the shop, as it was open Sunday-Friday, and they worked together until her mother couldn't drive anymore.

Then in 2002 when the congregation began building the new addition, she was asked to be a part of the design team along with Marsha Stein and Cindy Schmerin.

Reflecting on her time Janice said, "It is a lot different now than it was. Everybody was shopping there, using it for gift purchases." Even how they purchased the merchandise was different. She used to go to markets to buy and usually the markets were at the time of the Rabbinical and Sisterhood conventions. What they used to sell was very different! She laughed remembering the tin menorahs she used to sell. "Pieces are becoming more art-like pieces and people are keeping them out all year now, showing them off." "It is no longer generations passing down pieces but, young people are getting their own and are proud to display them."

"Not only did I love the shop, but I also worked with two rabbis, Rabbi Karff & Rabbi Lyon. They were/are everyday people and they they became part of my life. I know what you can do there as a volunteer, you can make the change."

After 48 years, she left the giftshop in 2014 after her husband had passed away. Janice currently lives in Houston, her home for 87 years. Before COVID-19 struck, she was actively volunteering with Dress for Success. She and others were honored in April 2019 for their work with the Sisterhood.

When Janice retired, the current manager, Anita Seline (fifth generation member) was hired. Anita had worked with Janice as a gift representative and she told Janice that when she retired, she would love to run the shop. She has been doing so for eight years.


