Truth for the Future

In recent months, many lessons from the past have been recalled to ease our fears about the present and to move us to do something about the future. Wise men and women, from Albert Einstein to Amanda Gorman, have reflected on their generation's ills and what it owes the world. Every generation hence will undoubtedly inherit or create its own ills, and every generation will have to examine its deeds for the impact they will make. There are crises that loom large, today, or which appear larger than those we've already known, but there are no crises that we can't overcome, yet.

A colleague reminded me that the Chinese symbol for crisis is a combination of two other Chinese symbols: danger and opportunity. If we're wise enough to learn from every source, then we should acknowledge the dangers that are rife in our generation, and then address them with new opportunities. In this regard, Judaism thinks about crisis similarly. Judaism, a religion of action, sees the world as it is and envisions how to it ought to be. This orientation to the world is rooted in the covenantal relationship Jews have with God. We are partners who rely on each other. One might say that God is commander (mitzaveh) and we receive God's commandments (mitzvot). How we hear them is reflected in our moral responsibility to choose to do them well. If we do, then there's every reason to believe that the world can know greater justice and compassion. In the end, crises only hide opportunities waiting to be revealed through faithfulness, compassion, and truth.

Faith isn't in short supply; many people claim to have it. Compassion isn't lacking; we run to heal the suffering. Truth, however, is struggling; we can't recognize it easily anymore. Without truth, we won't overcome the crises of our generation, and opportunities for a better future will be out of reach. In the past, truth prevailed, and it enabled us to find opportunities after crises such as WWII and the Holocaust, Vietnam, and Watergate.

In light of all the fears we face, today, I still have hope that, like generations past, we will find new opportunities for us and generations hence. But without truth, without demanding the truth, we have no hope. Truth is never relative. Truth, the "emes," as we say in Yiddish, is at the heart of the covenant between God and humanity, and our dearest obligation to the future.

WELCOMING CANTOR KENNETH FEIBUSH



Starting July 1, Cantor Kenneth Feibush joins the clergy of Congregation Beth Israel. He grew up in Watchung, NJ in a house filled with music. He grew up playing violin, his sister played viola, and his grandmother and great uncles sang at parties and gathering. He graduated from Rutgers College Phi Beta Kappa with a double major in Middle Eastern Studies and Psychology and a minor in Spanish. During college, Cantor Feibush was active with Rutgers Hillel, serving as head of the Reform community and reaching out with Shabbat on different campuses. A favorite memory from Rutgers Hillel was organizing a counter-protest to the Westboro Baptist Church. He also sang in Deep Treble, a coed a cappella group on campus, writing arrangements and producing concerts, including one featuring Miranda Sings before she starred on Broadway and Netflix.

While Cantor Feibush never thought he would pursue the cantorate, some would say this path was inevitable. At his second Shabbat at Temple Sholom in Plainfield, NJ, he volunteered to help lead "Mi Shebeirach" since the cantor was on vacation. When Cantor Feibush became a Bar Mitzvah, Rabbi Joel Abraham and Cantor Wendy Shermet were the first people to encourage him to consider becoming a cantor. At his Confirmation, Cantor Shira Nafshi wanted him to learn the special trope for chanting the Book of Ruth. While home from college, Cantors Darcie Sharlein and Vicky Glikin invited him to sing duets during services, and he was in the rotation for leading summer services and shiva minyanim. After so much encouragement he attended an open house at HUC-JIR in New York, was accepted, and has never looked back.

While attending HUC-JIR, he taught numerous B'nei Mitzvah in New York and served three pulpits: Beth Shalom Synagogue, now Unified Jewish Synagogue, in Baton Rouge, LA, Congregation Or Hatzafon in Fairbanks, Alaska, and Hebrew Tabernacle in Washington Heights, New York City. He also served

as co-leader of the HUC Soup Kitchen which served hundreds of meals every Monday. He was ordained in 2016 and has served Temple Sholom of West Essex in Cedar Grove, NJ for six years.

Cantor Feibush has the task of balancing the thousands of years of tradition with modern and contemporary melodies. According to Cantor Feibush, "I see the melodies as more than merely songs but different ways of interpreting the prayers. From the days of the Psalms and the chants of the Levite choir to today's eclectic mix using different instruments and musical styles, Jews convey Torah and offer prayers through melody and rhythm. You could say that the Mourner's Kaddish was one of the first raps!" Reciting the appropriate melodies of the life cycles, birth, B'nei Mitzvah, weddings, and funerals, is a special part of that process, too. Alongside Rabbis Lyon and Scott, Cantor Feibush will build a musical vision across worship, Shlenker School, MBJLC, and life cycle.

Outside of the cantorate and music, Cantor Feibush enjoys reading, languages, travel, and knitting. Despite being partly color blind, he is proud of knitting an afghan of the United States in multiple colors. Other fun facts: he cannot ride a bicycle, his childhood dog had a run-in with an emu, and he has been to has been to 49 of the 50 states. He is looking forward to serving Congregation Beth Israel and planting roots in Houston.

"Our Transition Team is working to make his move to Houston and first few months at Beth Israel smooth and welcoming. I think our members will be impressed by Cantor Feibush's musicianship, experience, and energy level. He is excited about joining our Clergy. We are hoping that members will join us at the Summer Chapel Services, bring the family, and introduce themselves to our new Cantor before the calendar gets busier after Labor Day. We want to give him a 'Texas-size' welcome."

- A large reference collection for use in the library


We continue to expand our collection with current scholars and the latest fiction. Let us know if you have suggestions for new books. Come and see what we have for you.

SOCIAL JUSTICE AT BETH ISRAEL IS GROWING STRONG, THANKS TO DEDICATED CONGREGANTS

We're visiting Temenos (a residence for formerly homeless Houstonians, meaning "safe haven") every month, under Beth Schneider's coordination. Last month, Dena Mark's Bulgarian folk dance group performed, and then invited residents and staff to join the dance. This month, Beth, regular volunteers Barbara H and Denise E, and Naomi W and her daughter Hannah, showed residents how to do facial massages in a self-care spa hour. Next month we'll be sharing karaoke and treats! We're thrilled that more and more residents know who we are and are glad Beth Israel will be with them every 2nd Saturday afternoon.

Interfaith Ministries for Greater Houston staff met with us on April 10, to inform us how we can support refugee families coming to Houston. We learned more about immigrants' experiences from congregants Dom B and Jennifer C. Several congregants have registered with Volunteer Houston so they can work directly with new immigrants; Jenifer N has been helping them learn to use digital tools. Dr. Paul Scott gives free eye exams; other congregants have made financial and in-kind donations. We hope more congregants will decide to help refugees in our hometown.

Our district's Houston Police Commander Hassig and head of our security, Commander Collins, met with us May 3, to share their perspectives and hear our concerns about community security. Warren R coordinated a constructive conversation, so that everyone felt heard and respected. We hope to find ways to support our local police and to strengthen safety for everyone.

Dena and Lisa are representing Beth Israel on the Houston Gun Safety Campaign, which was formed from our Muslim Jewish Gun Safety Campaign. We've met with Police Chief Finner to identify how we can work together to increase safe gun storage and use, to decrease gun thefts and injuries. We held a first team planning meeting with the HPD, FBI, ATF, District Attorney's office and Minaret Foundation to develop our resources and public meeting for the fall. On May 27, we joined Rabbi Scott at a City Hall press conference led by Bishop Dixon, head of Houston NAACP, to share Judaism's teachings related to gun violence.

LYON COHEN SYMPOSIUM

On April 7, Congregation Beth Israel hosted its Sixth Annual Lyon Cohen Symposium in Wolff-Toomim Hall. It had been two years since the congregation welcomed back the community to one of its most popular events in person, and more than 300 guests were able to participate and learn from an esteemed group of panelists. This year's topic was titled "Pursuing Justice in our Criminal Justice System," and it featured Senior Rabbi David Lyon who moderated a panel of guests including Chief Judge Lee Rosenthal of the United States District Court, Southern District of Texas, Houston Police Chief of Police Troy Finner, and Tracie Jae, Activist and Community Organizer - The Quiet Rebel, LLC.

David Scott, RJE, Director of Lifelong Learning and Engagement welcomed the guests to the program and also introduced the Hon. Ellen Cohen and her daughter, Marcie Zlotnik, who chairs the Lyon Cohen Symposium Steering Committee. Cohen was married to Mr. Lyon Cohen, a community businessman in whose memory the event is named, for 42 years, and she spoke about her husband's commitment to Jewish values and ethics throughout his life. Their daughter, Marcie and her husband, Bob Zlotnik, created the Lyon Cohen Symposium Fund eight years ago for the purpose of establishing an ongoing program devoted to Lyon Cohen's legacy and the importance of educating the congregation and larger community about Jewish ethics. In his memory and honor, the Lyon Cohen Merit Scholarship was also created, which provides for a \$5,000 merit scholarship to incoming college, current college, and graduate students who demonstrate a commitment to Jewish

values and ethics. The recipient for the 2022 Lyon Cohen Merit Scholarship was Zoey Hess, daughter of Kelly and Clive Hess.

In the area of criminal justice reform, Rabbi Lyon began by asking each panelist to discuss the greatest challenge they see in the area of criminal justice in our community and beyond. Most notably, the issue of general apathy was raised and the need for greater civic engagement around important issues that affect an entire community. Judge Rosenthal discussed how she is limited by what the law allows her to do in carrying out criminal sentences, for example, and Chief Finner discussed the importance of maintaining a high degree of morale and inspiration among officers of the Houston Police Department. Ms. Jae provided an insight into issues that members of our community face around injustice and discrimination based on gender, race, and other factors. Rabbi Lyon shared wisdom from the Jewish Bible including lessons in Torah, all of which demonstrate our obligation to continue to pursue justice. Additional issues that were discussed throughout the evening that focused on the criminal justice system included bail reform, sentencing guidelines, reallocating funding, and behavioral treatment for nonviolent offenders. Certainly there is much more to be done as we focus on the important mitzvah of pursuing justice, and the panelists all contributed to an evening of greater understanding and education about different perspectives in our criminal justice system.


Outside of work, Christian loves the food scene in Houston, enjoys golfing, fishing, and spending time with his dog, Fin.

CONGREGATION BETH ISRAEL REVENUE: WAYS TO SUPPORT CONGREGATION BETH ISRAEL

REVENUE BREAKDOWN



A synagogue is more than a business or nonprofit organization; it's a religious institution, and we are in the "business" of making Jewish souls. Like other businesses, we must manage a budget and be fiscally responsible with our resources. So, how does the Congregation support itself financially, and where does it derive its revenues? Below, we will describe the seven different types of support that keep Congregation Beth Israel operating.

Annual Commitments (80%)

Member annual commitments account for the largest amount of support that Congregation Beth Israel receives to fund the operating budget. These unrestricted donations are our primary resource so we can provide outstanding clergy and staff; a beautiful safe campus; worship services with a live stream option; religious school; family and adult education; programming; pastoral care; life cycle events; social justice activities; and other general overhead costs.

If all member families were able to contribute at what we call "the sustaining level," or \$3,000 annually, our operating budget would be fully funded. But, because only 25 percent of our Congregation can give at this level or above, we must incorporate other fundraising activities throughout the year and rely on the distributions from our Endowment Fund.

Endowment Support (4%)

A growing endowment fund is crucial for the longterm future of our Congregation. It is designed to keep the principal corpus intact so it can grow over time but allow for an annual percentage of its investment income to be distributed and used to support programs, operations, or purposes specified by the donor. The unrestricted endowments (Samuel E. Karff Endowment Fund and Old Endowment Fund) at Beth Israel support our operating budget. The annual distribution from these unrestricted funds only makes up roughly 20 percent of the total annual endowment distribution. Growing the Samuel E. Karff Endowment Fund will allow us to be less reliant on Annual Commitments while strengthening our financial future and ensuring financial stability and sustainability.

Share the Load (3%)

Since 2011, Share the Load has been a popular fundraising campaign that the Temple promotes annually. Having raised more than \$1 million since its inception, it is an opportunity to direct gifts to specific programs, events, and expenses. Share the Load bridges the gap between the Temple budget needs and Annual Commitment donations.

Events (2%)

Events are a fun, meaningful, and valuable fundraising tool. Our most notable events are the Samuel E. Karff Leadership Gala and the Golf Tournament. The Samuel E. Karff Leadership Award honors those who lead with extraordinary deeds rooted in Judaism, performed for the benefit of others who find in Beth Israel a spiritual home dedicated to excellence in worship, education, and community. Another newly introduced and very successful event is the Golf Tournament – more than 130 Beth Israel congregants and friends bringing community and Judaism together on the course.

General Donations (2%)

Recognizing simchas and loved ones' memories is a beautiful tradition in the Jewish faith. When donations are made to the Temple Fund, these unrestricted gifts help support the ongoing annual operating needs of the Temple. Donations made to the Burke Technology Fund support our livestream efforts, and the Building and Landscape Fund ensure the continued maintenance of our beautiful campus. Donations made to other temple funds support areas of programming, other community initiatives, or other important needs at the clergy's discretion.

Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center (6%)

The Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center is the lifelong learning department that oversees the religious school and adult education classes. While tuition is paid by families like most congregational religious school programs, it is a loss leader. The revenue generated by tuition and fees only covers approximately 55 percent of the cost of running the program. Because religious education is a priority and part of our mission, the Temple's Operating Budget helps to support the additional 45 percent of expenses that are necessary to pay for faculty, staff, books, licenses, and other programming materials.

Other (3%)

Other sources of funds that support the Temple operating budget include grants, interest income, and dividends.

What is an annual commitment?

The annual commitment is the sustenance for the Temple and viewed as a sacred gift. Our main resource is our members annual commitments.

The ideal giving level is \$3,000 per family or "sustaining contribution," but trust that members will make an annual contribution at a level that is comfortable and meaningful for them. While we understand that everyone is not able to give at the sustaining level, we are so grateful for all our members and to those who give much more.

How is the \$3000 "sustaining contribution" amount calculated?

"Sustaining" is our total annual operating budget, less other sources of revenue divided by the number of member families. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, our operating expenses are \$4.8 million and the number of member families nearly 1500.

What are the giving levels above sustaining?

We are so grateful to have members who can give at a level greater than sustaining to underwrite others who cannot. When we give with holiness, we gain as much as we give.

Why do we pay an annual commitment and what does it support?

Annual commitments are the sustenance for the Temple and viewed as a sacred gift. In the Torah, we learn that synagogue commitments are an obligation for anyone who values Jewish communal life. We depend on the financial support of annual commitments to run the day-to-day operations and fulfill our mission. The operating budget allows us to employ our clergy and staff; maintain a beautiful, safe campus; conduct worship services with a live stream option; provide a religious school, family, and adult education; counseling; holiday celebrations; programming; pastoral care; life cycle events; social justice activities; and supports other general overhead costs.

What do I get for my annual commitment?

In our vibrant and diverse community, you will find a wide range of opportunities to engage spiritually, educationally, socially, and emotionally in Jewish life. You are part of a sacred community made up of caring clergy, staff, and fellow congregants to help you learn and grow, to celebrate your blessings, and support you through life's challenges. A flourishing congregation for more than 165 years, you are supporting the continuation of Jewish life in Greater Houston and beyond. Only members are entitled to enroll their children in our religious school, given voting privileges, attend High Holy Day services, hold board or committee positions, and have access to our Clergy for all life cycle events and other personal needs. You receive all communications - weekly newsletters, quarterly bulletins, special announcements, and invitations to upcoming events - and access to numerous adult education and social justice programs.



Why does the Temple increase my annual commitment every year?

Each year, our staff and leadership work tirelessly to present a balanced budget to our Congregation. We create the budget based on the promises/ pledges/commitments that our members make. Like other businesses, we are consistently faced with financial challenges including rising costs, aging infrastructure, changing technology, and unfilled obligations. As a Jewish religious institution, we also are faced with increasing security issues, the desire for innovative programming, and round the clock services. Although membership commitments are voluntary, each year we ask for a nominal increase to your donation so we can maintain the same level of service to our members.

Why do I have to pay religious school tuition in addition to my annual commitment?

Giving our children a Jewish education is part of our mission. In most synagogues, congregational religious schools, like our Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center (MBJLC), tuition and fees only cover about half the cost of providing a robust, comprehensive Jewish education. The Temple operating budget absorbs the rest. Our MBJLC Faculty includes full-time and part-time, paid staff members who provide learning opportunities for all children enrolled in MBJLC, including those with special learning needs. In addition to our faculty and staff costs, our curriculum, books, licensing fees, and other materials are additional costs to run the program.

Are annual commitments tax deductible?

Annual commitments and all other donations are 100 percent tax deductible. Please consult your tax professional about your specific circumstances.

What if I cannot afford to pay an annual commitment?

We understand that some members cannot contribute at the recommended levels and that others are able to give significantly more. We encourage all members to discuss their contribution confidentially with our Executive Director, Pam Kutner. It is our wish that everyone who wants to be part of our community can join regardless of their financial ability.
