MBJLC KICKS OFF ITS YEAR OF LEARNING

On Sunday morning, August 28th, Congregation Beth Israel's Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center (MBJLC) kicked off its year of learning with food, fun, and friends. The MBJLC held its Opening Day event where families were invited to bring their children to meet the MBJLC Faculty in creative learning spaces set up throughout the Temple. Rather than focusing on classrooms, homework, and examinations, the MBJLC creates learning opportunities that strengthens Jewish character, teaches Jewish values, and imbues our children with an understanding of what Judaism can mean in their own lives. After bringing their children to their respective learning spaces with their MBJLC Faculty members, **David Scott**, RJE, Director of Lifelong Learning and Engagement, welcomed all the parents to Wolff-Toomim Hall for a delicious brunch.

Co-Chairs of the MBJLC Committee, **Allie Falender** and **Andrea Eoff**, along with MBJLC Committee Board Liaison **Lauren Sorkin**, were present to guide parents and answer questions. Sisterhood Gift Shop leaders including **Anita Seline** and **Jenifer Nech** and Schachtel Library Temple Librarian **Susan Whitman** and archivist **Sarah Frazer**, were present to showcase recent arrivals. In addition to David Scott, **Rabbi David Lyon**, **Rabbi Adrienne Scott**, **Cantor Kenneth Feibush**, and **Richard Kaplan**, Temple President, all addressed the parents to reinforce the importance of regular attendance, engagement, and to preview the types of learning the children will be exposed to throughout the year. **Will Burdine**, Chair of the Temple's Security Committee, also made a special presentation related to security protocols and safety measures that are in place on Sunday mornings and throughout the week at Congregation Beth Israel. All parents were provided security badges, were able to register their children for MBJLC sessions if they had not yet done so, picked up T-shirts for their children to wear while on campus and throughout the community, and were invited to reacquaint themselves with the Temple after nearly three years of being away since the pandemic

During the presentation, David Scott discussed the culture of the MBJLC as a learning center and reviewed the learning each grade will receive this year. In addition to a series of Family Education initiatives called “Morim Mishpacha,” which are part of the preparation for B’nei Mitzvah, Scott introduced a new initiative called “Tiyulim,” which means trips. Beginning at the third-grade level when formal Hebrew instruction is introduced, children will be invited on special field trips with their parents to be exposed to Judaism throughout the community. For example, families in third grade will be invited to the Houston Zoo for a scavenger hunt where they will learn all about the animals of the Torah. This event will coincide with the Torah reading of Noah’s Ark, and the children will learn Hebrew names of the animals, discover where in the Torah they are discussed, and learn about these animals and how they are cared for today. Older children will be invited to the Museum of Fine Arts Houston, the Holocaust Museum of Houston, and will tour the West Dallas Cemetery to engage in a mitzvah project. Other grades will explore and learn about Jewish Family Services’ Celebration Company program and tour other historical sites of Jewish Houston, including Congregation Beth Israel’s previous locations in its 168-year history, especially our third location on Holman Street.

Concluding the morning with lunch at Kenny & Ziggy’s will be an especially wonderful experience as **Ziggy Gruber** will introduce children to historically Jewish foods of Eastern Europe and their place in the American Jewish landscape.

Reconnecting our children with our Temple history and the wider Jewish community is an especially important theme this year in addition to learning important Jewish content. The goal of the MBJLC is to provide all children with experiences and engagement with our clergy and educators that they cannot receive the rest of the week – *even if they attend Jewish elementary day schools, middle schools, or high schools throughout Houston.*

After inviting parents to reconnect with their children, everyone was invited to the Sanctuary for a kickoff concert led by Cantor Feibush and **Mike Mason**, Director of Family Engagement and Music Education. Rabbi Scott participated in singing with them and everyone was given shaker eggs to participate together. The feeling of community was contagious as all the children joined along with dozens of Madrichim Teen Leaders who accompanied them throughout the morning and assisted the Faculty. **Kerri Zerlin**, Assistant Director of the MBJLC, led a raffle that concluded the morning with gifts for selected children who won and cupcakes for everyone as we celebrated the beginning of our year (and Kerri’s birthday!) MBJLC Sessions begin on Sunday morning, September 11th, and there is still time to register your children and grandchildren. On August 26th, after a nearly two-year hiatus, hundreds of worshippers gathered at Congregation Beth Israel for Shir Shabbat. Led by Cantor Kenneth Feibush with arrangements by Cantor Feibush, Mike Mason, Director of Family Engagement and Musical Education, and Music Director Mark Vogel, both new and familiar melodies were incorporated into a beautiful Shabbat service. The theme of this Shir Shabbat was “Shiru L’Adonai,” Sing to God, and the music kept everyone’s feet stomping and hands clapping. A dynamic instrumental ensemble accompanied the singing, which also included Rabbi Adrienne Scott, and Rabbi David Lyon framed the entire service with his D’var Torah focused on the gift of sight. “Seeing is believing,” he remarked based on the weekly Torah reading, and “sometimes seeing isn’t believing ... believing is seeing.” Throughout the service, worshippers received musical shakers that helped everyone participate and enjoy the service.

Cantor Feibush was welcomed enthusiastically and enjoyed much gratitude for his role in crafting and leading the Shir Shabbat service. We are looking forward to many years of musical leadership with Cantor Feibush.

MADRICHIM KICKOFF



2022-2023 MBJLC Madrichim

The 2022-2023 Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center Madrichim kicked off the year with a Madrichim Orientation on August 20. Nearly 30 Congregation Beth Israel teens came together at Palace Social for an evening of training, learning, food, and fun.

The night started with MBJLC Assistant Director Kerri Zerlin leading the Madrichim in some getting-to-know-you games and icebreakers, then initiated a discussion among them on how to be the best role models in the classroom and out. Madrichim, who are 8th through 12th graders, help in MBJLC learning spaces on Sunday mornings, helping to teach and guide the children along with MBJLC faculty. Kehillah High Director Danielle Alexander joined the training to help the Madrichim understand the connection between the two programs. The Madrichim program is the community service arm of Kehillah High and teens must be enrolled in the high school program to participate in the MBJLC learning spaces.

“The MBJLC training was a great way to learn all about being Madrichim and to get to know your fellow Madrichim,” said Beryt Scott, a 9th grade Madricha.

After a pizza dinner with the Motzi (the blessing before the meal) led by Rabbi Adrienne Scott and Cantor Kenneth Feibush, the Madrichim broke apart into small groups for more intimate discussion with Clergy and staff. Small groups were led by Cantor Feibush; David Scott, Director of Lifelong Learning and Engagement; Mike Mason, Director of Young Family Learning and Music Engagement; Danielle Alexander; and Stephanie Shargal, Kehillah High Program Coordinator.

After dinner and games, Madrichim were each given a game card and spent time bonding over video games and bowling. The big-ticket winners of the night were 10th graders Rotem Yaari, Yael Namer, 11th grader Addison Claridge, and 9th grader Samantha Lepow, who pooled their tickets to purchase toys to donate to the MBJLC. After this night of excitement, all the Madrichim are very excited to get into the classroom and start to make an impact on their Jewish community.

“The Madrichim training taught me leadership skills and prepared me for the first day and the year,” said Claridge, who is starting her fourth year in the program.

- Together with The Way Home, a program of the Houston Coalition for the Homeless, we identify apartment communities that house formerly homeless families and individuals.
- We partner with Second Servings of Houston to bring their PopUp Grocery Store Program, which provides healthy food choices, to a selected apartment community.
- Synagogue volunteers set up and assist at the monthly PopUp Grocery Store.
- Apartment residents can select nutritious food at the PopUp Grocery Store at no cost.
- Onsite and virtual nutritionists and dieticians enable residents to begin or continue their journey toward food security and making healthy food choices.



WHY

- More than 16% of Houstonians are food insecure and have limited or uncertain access to enough food, especially healthy options.
- Demand at the Houston Food Bank soared 30% in 2021, adding to food access issues.
- Food insecurity can have significant negative implications on a person's health.
- The model of enabling and teaching aligns with the Jewish values of Tzedakah (justice and righteous giving). We can help food-insecure Houstonians most when we supply healthy food and offer tools and skills to become more self-sufficient.

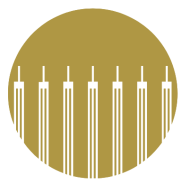



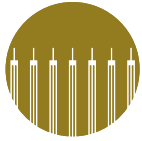
