On Israel's 75th Anniversary

On the High Holy Days 5783, I raised matters of Jewish identity because we faced the prospect of a New Year with heightened antisemitism. Though it's been said in the past that a rise in antisemitism is good for Jewish identity because it forces us to see ourselves as a people who are stronger when we stand together, it's a misnomer and history proves that it's a bad defense. Antisemitism can't be defeated when we band together with our backs towards our enemies. Instead, we have to face our enemies together and sometimes alone.

In the fall, I shared with you that Ambassador Deborah Lipstadt, twice a guest in our congregation and special envoy to monitor and combat antisemitism, also known worldwide as an expert on the Holocaust and antisemitism who defeated a Holocaust denier in a London courthouse, made the startling announcement that "Unfortunately, antisemitism is a growth industry." And, without equivocation, she urged, "We should never let the Jewish people feel stronger in their Judaism *because* of antisemitism. In fact, quite the opposite. Let us resolve to be Jewish *nonetheless.*"

Lipstadt believes that we're all (af al pea chen) "אף על פי כן Jews," we're "Despite-it-all-Jews; Even-so-Jews; Nonetheless-Jews." She was referencing a refugee ship from Nazi Germany, she called a bathtub, because its condition was so poor. Like other refugee ships, some of them successful and others that were not, it carried Jews from war-torn Europe to then Palestine, loaded with refugee Jews. The ship was called the "Af Al Pea Chen," Despite it all, because of its precarious voyage and its ultimate end. So, we say, Af Al Pea Chen, despite it all, we're Jews who have fallen and will climb back up again.

This assertive and self-defining position came with the arrival of refugees to a land they would come to know as Israel. It would be their refuge, their haven, and their home, because there was no other place in the world that would have them. And today, as antisemitism rages, Israeli Jews know that if there is no Israel, they would have nowhere to go. American Jews have no reason to feel any safer just because we're not in Israel. Because if we do nothing about antisemitism in America, then we will have nowhere to go but Israel, too. But I believe that America needs Jews, and Israel needs Jews in America. I'm very pleased to be a Jew in America who also loves Israel. I can do both and so can you. We don't always agree with either nation's politics, economics, or social issues, but that's not the point. The point is that we have a seat at the table, a right to vote, and a way to make a difference, and not only for ourselves, but also for our children. We need to be at the table, because, as it's been said, "If you're not at the table, then you're on the menu."

Antisemitism is the root of every evil that rears its head as raw bigotry and racism because Jews are the perennial scapegoat. So it isn't about hiding Jewish life, culture, heritage, language, or its future to be safe. It's about celebrating Israel's 75th anniversary this spring and Jewish life in America. Proudly, Congregation Beth Israel celebrates Israel's sovereignty and our Jewish people's strength despite it all, even so, and nonetheless.

ADL, BETH ISRAEL KULANU PROGRAM HELPS HUNDREDS UNDERSTAND AND RESPOND TO ANTISEMITISM

Nearly 230 people attended Congregation Beth Israel and ADL Southwest's *All of us (KULANU!) Fighting Antisemitism* seminar Dec. 8, which provided the latest information on antisemitic attacks, helped participants understand the importance of fighting antisemitism, and empowered them to recognize and respond to anti-Jewish hate.

Participants gathered in Wolff-Toomim Hall to hear a moving keynote address from ADL Central Division Vice President Cheryl Drazin.. Cheryl was on the ground in Colleyville, Texas on Jan. 15, 2022, when a gunman held congregants of Colleyville's Beth Israel Synagoge hostage for 11 hours. Cheryl inspired the audience with a stirring account of what happened that day, how ADL participated in the response, and how the ordeal affected her personally.

A panel featuring targets of antisemitism moderated by ADL Southwest Regional Director Mark Toubin followed Cheryl's presentation, and included renowned vaccine researcher and creator Peter Hotez, M.D., Ph.D., dean for the National School of Tropical Medicine at Baylor College of Medicine, talking about how antisemites have attacked him and his work; Eliana Antonoff and her father Michael, giving their account of how they responded when a teacher in Eliana's school presented an antisemitic lesson in her class; and The Shlenker School's Director of Admissions and Development Tara Gassett speaking about antisemitic fliers peppering her neighborhood and how she responded.

After the panel, participants went to one of four breakout sessions designed to empower them to

take action against antisemitism. Gittel Francis, LMSW explained how she counsels victims of antisemitism in her session; Rabbi Kenny Weiss, Executive Director of Houston Hillel helped participants understand how to respond to anti-Jewish hate on college campuses; ADL Senior Associate Director Dena Marks illustrated how antisemites are promoting an old hatred in new ways and gave tips on how to react productively; and ADL Education Director Dr. Chantel L. Henderson and facilitator Randi Sonenshein provided lessons on how K-12 students can recognize and respond to antisemitism. "The workshop was well done and practical," said Scott Cantor, a participant in the K-12 workshop, "Real-life examples of antisemitism that children experience pushed us to get realistic about how to respond to such situations."

Congregation Beth Israel Senior Rabbi David Lyon ended the evening with a call to action, citing a famous quote from Micah: "Do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with your G-d." Rabbi Lyon told the audience they must not sit by and ignore antisemitisim. "We must do... we must respond with love.... And we must walk" toward responses and solutions, he said, because if we don't, antisemitism will continue to grow.

The next Kulanu program in the spring will welcome Latino/Latina community members

to share their experiences of bias. Anyone who experiences or witnesses antisemitism or other forms of hate may report it online at adl.org/reportincident.

With our partners at the Food and Faith Collaborative, a community of volunteers from Congregations Beth Israel, Beth Yeshurun, Brith Shalom, Emanu El, and Houston Congregation for Reform Judaism we work closely with Second Servings and Houston Coalition for the Homeless to organize and staff PopUp Grocery Stores at low-income adult living facilities. This increases food security and nutritional self-sufficiency in the Houston area, which is critical since more than 16% of Houstonians are food insecure and demand at Houston Food Bank recently soared 30%. There is no cost to consumers and this supplements what they can afford to buy each month.

Thanks to Beth Schneider, we continue to visit Temenos, a residence for formerly homeless Houstonians, to share fun activities. We'll be celebrating the opening of their new building in a few months!

Our Gun Safety Campaign kicked off last month with a news conference, website (houstongunsafety.org), and billboards. Rabbi Lyon welcomed representatives from the Mayor's Office, City Council, Houston Police Dept, District Attorney's Office, FBI, ATF and other organizations to present a dramatic case to save lives by increasing safe gun storage in homes and cars. This is the culmination of efforts started before the pandemic. Our goal is to provide education and resources to help prevent gun deaths, accidents and thefts.

KIDS' MEALS 5,000 A HUGE SUCCESS

Congregation Beth Israel members really know how to make a difference. On a beautiful January Sunday morning, over 200 volunteers came together to make 5,000 sack meals for Houston's hungriest preschool-aged children. Kids' Meals, Inc., our partner organization, works to supply food for children under 6 because they are too young to qualify for school-based free meal programs in the state of Texas.

Our morning began in the Sanctuary with the students of the Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center, their families and all of the volunteers. Cantor Kenneth Feibush, along with our weekend guest, Cantor Rosalie Will, led us in song and prayer to help us all to frame the important work that we were about to do.

We heard from John Day, Chief Operations and Program Officer for Kids' Meals who taught our community about the Kids' Meals mission and the staggering statistics about childhood hunger in Houston. Did you know that 1 in 4 children in Houston are food insecure, meaning they lack reliable access to sufficient quantities of healthy, nutritious food?



We moved into Wolff-Toomim Hall and in less than 75 minutes our community made those 5,000 lunches and loaded them all onto the Kids' Meals refrigerated trucks. Thank you to our captains and the MBJLC Madrichim, led by Irv Berger who guided the volunteers as they made their way up and down the sandwich making and production lines. While the adults, older children and teens were in Wolff-Toomim Hall, the younger MBJLC students, led by MBJLC Assistant Director Kerri Zerlin, had their own Mitzvah Morning experience with additional mitzvah projects.



Registration is open for the second biennial Kehillah High Israel Trip, taking place this summer from June

14 to July 4. This transformative experience is open to current 10th and 11th grade students in the Greater Houston Jewish community.

During the three weeks in Israel, participants will have the opportunity to build personal connections to Israel and fully develop a relationship with the country by interacting with the people, tasting the food, and taking in the rich history, culture, and natural beauty. The trip will also coincide with the country's 75thanniversary celebrations.

In the summer of 2021, Danielle Alexander, Kehillah High Founding Director, led the inaugural Kehillah High Israel Trip of 32 10th-12th graders representing eight congregations in the Greater Houston area. "Looking back at this trip and the young Jewish leaders who chose to take part, I'm so inspired by how they embraced both their Israel studies prior to and during the trip and their community despite a stream of obstacles," Alexander said.

"The effects of this trip are extending far beyond the 21 days itself. Teens who went with us to Israel are engaging their parents, other family members, and friends in their experiences," she added "The trip has and will continue to generate numerous conversations, in-person and online, deepening the participants' impact and understanding. This trip will impact the future of the Houston Jewish community for decades."

Going to Israel will forever be a turning point in my life. The experience changed me as a person and completely reshaped my mindset toward Israel and Judaism. I cherish the wide variety of knowledge I accumulated throughout our tour, and am so grateful to have had the opportunity to experience so many different things. From visiting an ultra-Orthodox community to shopping in the Machane Yehuda shuk, there was never a moment that wasn't full of Israeli experience and culture.

CONGREGATION BETH ISRAEL CHILDREN VISIT CELEBRATION COMPANY



This year Congregation Beth Israel's religious school program, The Miriam Browning Jewish Learning Center, is trying something new. Beginning in the third grade, all enrolled children are engaging in tiyulim, field trips, throughout the community. The goal of these tiyulimis to expose the children to new ways of seeing Jewish life beyond the borders and walls of the synagogue. Last fall, third graders went to the Houston Zoo for a program that coincided with the Torah reading of Noah's Ark. Recently, on February 12th, Senior Associate Rabbi Adrienne Scott, David Scott, Director of Lifelong Learning and Engagement, and Fourth Grade Faculty Member, Mark King, brought fourth grade children to Joan and Stanford Alexander Jewish Family Service's Celebration Company to coincide with February's Jewish Disability Awareness month and JFS's ReelAbilities. The children learned about the work of JFS and ways all our children can become more involved with this important organization.

Joined by Carol Silverman, JFS's Volunteer Coordinator and Program Assistant, and Celebration Company Employee, Becca Golub, the children learned about the important work of Celebration Company. After the discussion the children watched one of the this year's ReelAbilities films called Best Friends. It tells the story of a friendship that grows between two children, one of whom having special needs. Special guest, Joan Alexander, shared with the children her joy of the work of Celebration Company. She taught how we are all created B'tzelem Elohim, in the image of God, and how we should be grateful for how we are all different from one another. Rabbi Scott highlighted and taught about inclusion efforts and the work she does on behalf of the Temple's Inclusion Committee. The children learned how important it is for everyone in our community to feel included in all that we do. Carol then led the children on an activity using texture that was inspired by guest artist John Bramblitt, who is blind. Special thanks to teen leader (madrich), Ben Litofsky, for his support and

What is an annual commitment?

Annual member commitments support our operating budget and ensure that Congregation Beth Israel will be here for you and your family. It allows us to meet the extensive needs of our Congregation.

The ideal giving level is \$3,000 per family or "sustaining contribution," but trust that members will make an annual contribution at a comfortable and meaningful level for them. While we understand that everyone cannot give at the sustaining level, we are so grateful for all our members and those who provide much more.

How is the \$3000 "sustaining contribution" amount calculated?

"Sustaining" is our total annual operating budget, less other sources of revenue divided by the number of member families.

Why do we pay an annual commitment and what does it support?

We depend on the financial support of annual commitments to operate. The yearly operating need is the amount of money we need to spend each year to fulfill our mission and ensure that the Temple is preserved for the future. The operating budget provides support for clergy and staff; a beautiful, safe campus; worship services with a live stream option; religious school; family and adult education; counseling; holiday celebrations; programming; pastoral care; life cycle events; social justice activities; and other general overhead costs.

What do I get for my annual commitment?

In our vibrant and diverse community, you will find a wide range of opportunities to engage spiritually, educationally, socially, and emotionally in Jewish life. You are part of a sacred community of caring clergy, staff, and fellow congregants to help you learn and grow, celebrate your blessings, and support you through life's challenges. A flourishing congregation for over 165 years, you are supporting the continuation of Jewish life in Greater Houston and beyond. As a member of the congregation you are entitled to enroll your children in our religious school, given voting privileges, attend High Holy Days, hold board or committee positions, and have access to the Rabbi services for all life cycle events and other personal needs. You receive all mailings and e-mails, weekly newsletters, quarterly bulletins, special announcements, invitations to upcoming events, and access to numerous adult education and social justice programs.



THE STILL SMALL VOICE

The Still, Small Voice is a quarterly column that will appear in each issue of the Temple Bulletin. Written by Dr. Tom Cole, Director of the Center for Healing, Hope, and the Human Spirit, it will address specific issues embedded in the spiritual life of Reform Judaism and of Congregation Beth Israel.

WHERE HAVE ALL THE ANGELS GONE?

Until the 20th century, Jews believed in the reality of angels, who were thought to appear among us in everyday life.

In ancient Israel, the world of the spirit was intermingled with the world of everyday life. It was not somewhere out there but right here among us and within us. Today some Jews still see and occasionally experience the mysteries of the spirit in everyday life. For others spiritual experiences are illusions. And for still others there is a known or unknown longing for spiritual experiences that might bring us closer to God. One form of these experiences is an encounter with an angel, stories of which is actually more common today than you might think. The Hebrew name for angel is Malach, which also means messenger. Angels were thought to be messengers of God.

Recently, archeologists have dug under the floors of homes in ancient Mesopotamia. Among other things, they found amulets and simple ceramic bowels inscribed with personalized appeals to angels, God, and other sacred heroes. They pleaded for help in healing illnesses, restoring love in marriages, increasing business or protecting their home from demons and other evil forces.

And our Hebrew bible of course is filled with angelic figures, (usually disguised as men): the angels who came to Abraham's tent and announced that Sarah would have a child at 90 years old; the angel who stayed Abraham's hand as he prepared to sacrifice Isaac; the angel who wrestled with Jacob, whose name was changed to Israel, which means wrestling with God.

In the first few centuries of the Common Era, it was generally thought that two angels accompanied each family home after the Sabbath Service. If the Sabbath table was properly prepared with candles, the family would be blessed with assistance in everyday life.

When Reform Judaism first rebelled against Orthodox Judaism, our movement followed the lead of a culture which anointed science and rationality as the sole criteria of truth. Angels, along with other celestial beings fell into disrepute, and God alone reigned as Creator of the world and Divine architect of the covenant. But angels persist under the radar today, even in our liturgy. Every Sabbath evening, we sing the song "Shalom Aleichem," peace be unto you. Few of us know the translation of this song, which adopts the ancient notion of the angels who accompany us home from Sabbath services.

Peace be unto you ministering angels, angels of the Most High, the King of Kings, the Holy One, blessed be G-d.

Few people today say they believe in angels. But who knows? As we look for ways to bring home divine blessings from our Sabbath services, perhaps invisible angels are walking us home.
